### Meeting:

### Adrienne & Quincy talked about their trip to China

-Kate had volleyball practice but her mom and sister gave her side of things from the trip.

-Kate was adopted in 2006 when she was 7½ months old. She is 13 now.

-The trip was sponsored by the adoption agency. It was called Bridge of Love – Heritage Tour. These tours started in 2011.

-It was a Tour Bus Trip with 10 families on the bus (about 40 people) and there were 4 buses.

-Kate's trip was paid for by the Chinese government

-The trip was 10 days long.

-They visited the orphanage where Kate lived and met the nannies that took care of her.

-Kate said it felt like a tour, not like going home. She said it was fun meeting the girls in similar situations as herself. They still text and chat with each other.

-They were all girls because it was not common for boys to be put up for adoption, especially in rural areas. The law at the time said you could only have one child. Boys that were adopted would be ones with disabilities (medical needs, clef palate, etc.). They have changed the one child policy now, thus adoptions from China are less common.

-They went on Propaganda type events. Pictures were taken of the girls for the newspaper. Many cultural activities, Jade manufacturing, Terra Cotta Warrior Memorial, Hug a Panda, Hot Pot meal, traditional Chinese ear cleaning, tea ceremony, henna art on skin, Great Wall, and Tian'anmen Square.

-Records were not kept for the girls, so it is hard to say where their birth families are. Children were left on doorsteps, etc. Since it was not legal to have a 2<sup>nd</sup> child, they might have been paid to give up a child, or a safe sanctuary type program. Kate's family had her tested by 23 and Me. It might lead to locating some of her family eventually. 23 and Me can also help with medical genetics.

-Question: Was Kate glad about the trip? It was hard physically and emotionally. She still has unanswered questions.

-Most people they encountered spoke at least some English. They were treated well as tourists. They always felt safe, even at night. It is a heavily controlled state.

-School: 9 hours a day in Elementary School. High School is 18 hours a day, they eat all 3 meals at school. -There is a lot of traffic all the time. They go by license plate numbers to control the number of cars on the streets of the city. One day a week you cannot drive into the city or get a heavy fine. You'll need to take public transit on that day. Example: If you plate ends in a 1, you cannot drive on Monday. -There were also a lot of crowds.

It was a very interesting talk and enjoyed by all.
